Environmental Initiatives

Protecting our environment and preserving our green spaces are key values of the municipal council members. To encourage residents to adopt environmentally friendly habits, subsidies are being offered by the City of Notre-Dame-de-l'Île-Perrot. A number of them are intended to help residents reduce their water consumption, for example distributing free water saving kits or covering part of the cost of a rainwater barrel. The City is also seeking to reduce the amount of waste in landfills by subsidizing the purchase of cloth diapers and composters. Municipal council members are also concerned about air quality.



That is why the City is providing a subsidy to cover part of the cost of replacing old wood heaters. Lastly, the confirmed presence of emerald ash borers in NDIP is a major environmental concern. To reduce the damage done by these insects as much as possible, the City has earmarked funds to help residents replace affected ash trees. A complete list of subsidies can be found in the Initiatives tellement environnementales, which the municipal council officially introduced on April 22, in celebration of Earth Day.

Green thumb - Grasscycling

With spring almost here, snow shovels are giving way to gardening tools as we rediscover the joy of gardening. However, can we improve our habits to minimize our environmental footprint? Grasscycling (and leaf mulching in the fall) is a simple way to do that. It involves leaving grass clippings and leaves on the lawn after mowing. As they break down, the clippings become a natural fertilizer that greatly benefits the roots. Any lawn mower can be used for grasscycling, but installing a mulching blade yields better results. Grasscycling saves time and money, and it contributes to a healthy lawn without they use of additional fertilizer. As well, grasscycling reduces municipal household and yard waste collection costs, plastic bag use and the number of trucks on the road, which lowers greenhouse gas emissions.

HOT TOPIC 2

Family Action Plan

Residents already know that Notre-Dame-de-l'Île-Perrot is a great place to live and have a family. To raise awareness about all the services available to families in NDIP. the municipal council has developed the Family Action Plan in co-operation with officials from various municipal departments. The Family Action Plan presents the vision that the municipal council members have regarding family services and presents a list of those services, for example the new homework assistance service at the library, the policy on water for families with four children or more, and supervised activities in the gymnasium on Sunday afternoons. The municipal council took the opportunity at the pancake breakfast held as part of Family Week (May 15 to 21) to officially unveil the Notre-Dame-de-l'Île-Perrot Family Action Plan, a document that fuels residents' pride in living in Notre-Dame-de-l'Île-Perrot and that will no doubt encourage other families to come and settle here with us.
