

I have been pleased for some time to see that a new spirit of collaboration has been spreading across Île Perrot, and that there are already wonderful concrete examples of the work done jointly with my counterparts in neighbouring cities. The united approach of the island's four municipalities enabled us to make a strong case to the Programme d'aide financière aux infrastructures récréatives et sportives (PAFIRS) (recreational and sports infrastructure funding program) for the much-anticipated arena project. On the NDIP fire station file, we are working closely with Pincourt to maximize fire service, reduce response times and, ultimately, reduce insurance costs for many properties. In the end, construction of the station will provide better protection across our territory.

These two examples show that we can work together by focusing on what brings us together as well as on what makes us unique. Collaboration, unlike administrative amalgamation, allows us to highlight our commonalities as well as our individualities and to leverage them to jointly deliver major projects for all residents of our four municipalities.

TOPIC 1

Municipal Patrol

To foster an amicable community, Ville de NDIP has established municipal by-laws that govern the rights and responsibilities of residents in our beautiful city. During working hours, a team of Urban Planning Department inspectors travel throughout the territory and are able to respond as required. To maintain a presence and capacity to respond in the evening and on weekends, the City will establish a municipal patrol starting in summer 2020. Municipal patrol members will have the ability to enforce municipal by-laws outside of office hours, including those related to commercial door-to-door soliciting, nuisance (noise and other), parking and tree cutting. With the new patrol, Council hopes to reduce the irritants experienced by some residents by giving the City the ability to respond quickly to by-law infractions both during and outside office hours. We have also taken this initiative to reduce the occurrence of vandalism in the city's parks, which is increasingly costly and impacting the quality of life of users.

TOPIC 2

2020 Projects

As part of the budget process, Council approved projects to be completed in 2020. Of course, one of those major projects is construction of a fire station in NDIP. This year, we will be awarding the contract to design the plans and specifications for the future station, which is expected to be operational in the fall of 2021.

To improve the city's emergency response capacity, Council authorized the purchase of two large-capacity generators to provide power to municipal buildings in the event of a prolonged power failure. Maintaining municipal infrastructure is always a priority. Work planned for 2020 includes stabilizing a portion of the shoreline along Perrot Boulevard, which is increasingly subject to erosion, stabilizing some culverts under Perrot Boulevard, and continuing the paving plan for streets and sidewalks based on priority needs.

On the Community Services side, a major renovation of the Parc des Mésanges chalet will be completed and is much needed! In addition, a neighbourhood park will be built in the Marie-Marthe-Daoust sector, and the Vaudreuil-Soulanges S.O.U.PE. Festival will be held again this year. Council also plans to award a contract for the architectural design, plans and specifications for the Notre-Dame-de-la-Garde gym revitalization project.

IN THE CITY

Finally spring! For the various municipal departments, the end of winter and the arrival of milder weather mean a major clean up and the gradual opening of the infrastructure in our parks.

All of this work is interdependent and must be completed in a specific sequence. For example, before installing the bollards along the bike lanes, the streets must first be swept and lines repainted. In parks, as soon as the snow is gone, employees will open all sports fields as quickly as possible. Whether you're a tennis, basketball, skateboard or BMX enthusiast, we know you're looking forward to your favourite sports. But be patient – everything will be opened as soon as weather conditions are favourable.

GREEN THUMB

The NDIP City Council considers environmental issues very important. In 2020, a new series of initiatives entitled "Les 12 travaux tellement environnementaux" (12 highly environmental works) will be launched to better address the environmental concerns of residents. On Earth Day on April 25, 2020, you will be asked to share your ideas for environmental measures in your community. Several municipal initiatives will be presented at that time.
