HOT TOPIC 1

Progress on the NDIP fire station project

Over the past few weeks, the Municipal Council, with the invaluable expertise of our technical services team, has been guiding the work of D3 Architecture in developing the functional and technical plan for the future Notre-Dame-de-l'Île-Perrot fire station.

This important phase has helped pin down the parameters for the station to ensure that the public's needs are met. We are very satisfied with the work that has been done. The outcome has been a particularly well-designed tendering process for professional architectural and engineering services. As we opened the bids, we were pleased to see that several met all of the evaluation criteria. One of the bidders, a consortium of reputable companies, consisting of Patriarche Architecture and CCM2, stood out for the quality of its proposal. The schedule for the construction of this essential infrastructure when it comes to the safety of residents remains very tight. And the arrival of such a partner in the project confirms our belief that we can build a modern, well-adapted fire station by September 2021 as planned.

HOT TOPIC 2

New Farmers - Agroforestry Project

In 2013, an innovative agroforestry project was launched in Notre-Dame-de-l'Île-Perrot. Agroforestry is a farming method that focuses on the symbiosis of agriculture and forestry on a given parcel. The project is part of a Quebec movement that aims to multiply agroforestry sites and document them for scientific purposes in order to better understand their benefits and reproduce them in a variety of agricultural contexts. To achieve this, Notre-Dame-de-l'Île-Perrot is relying heavily on the collaboration of the Institut de recherches en biologie végétale at the Université de Montréal. In this context, several rows of different species of trees were planted in 2013 on a lot along boulevard Don-Quichotte, not far from the municipal workshops.

Unfortunately, the farmers who were supposed to plant the crops encountered a number of setbacks, leaving the project in limbo for the past few years. In late 2019, the Municipal Council decided to reactivate the project, and the municipality took over the file and began looking for new farmers to take over. The effort paid off, and two companies are now tending to the project. Over the next few years, AgriTropiQ, a company that specializes in producing African fruits and vegetables, will farm one portion. Another parcel will be farmed by resident Mathieu Robert, who will grow grains and possibly fruit and vegetables. This project is finally taking root!

GREEN THUMB

Licensed pesticides and contractors

NDIP by-laws provide that only low impact pesticides and biopesticides can be used by individuals and contractors. Synthetic pesticides are prohibited.

NDIP reminds you that contractors applying pesticides must hold a valid annual registration certificate to provide such services in the Perrot region. They must also have the necessary permits and certificates issued by MELCC. Please feel free to ask them for a copy. The list of authorized contractors is posted on the NDIP website.
